## Modern-Day Discrimination and the Black Lives Matter Movement

This Workshop challenges students to examine discrimination and its ongoing impact on societies worldwide. It encourages reflection on race, equality and activism through the lens of the Black Lives Matter movement while developing empathy, intercultural understanding and civic responsibility. It supports curriculum goals by helping students understand how democratic societies respond to social protest and calls for reform, while fostering reflective skills, empathy, and civic engagement.

Current example: Students explore racial profiling and police violence in the U.S., anti-LGBTQIA+ discrimination in North America and Europe and ongoing debates around trans rights.

### Topics:

- History and causes of discrimination and systemic racism
- Global racial justice movements and their social impact
- The Black Lives Matter movement in context (U.S. and Europe)
- Empathy and inclusion in democratic societies
- Human rights conventions against discrimination
