U.S. History and Civil Rights

This workshop supports U.S. History and Civic Education learning goals by providing a chronological overview of pivotal moments in American history and their influence on modern democracy. Students develop historical thinking skills by connecting past civil rights struggles to current global issues of justice and equality. They analyze how non-violent protest and civic engagement shaped the U.S. and continue to inspire democratic movements today.

Current example: Students examine voter suppressions in various U.S. states, Black Lives Matter protests in 2023, and discussions around systemic racism in the criminal justice system.

Topics:

- The transatlantic slave trade and abolition movements
- The U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights
- The Civil Rights movement: key figures and campaigns
- Non-violent protest and its influence on democracy
- Legacy of civil rights in modern social movements
